Objectives

Language Functions

- understanding questions/commands and responding
- describing parts of the body and movements

Vocabulary

- body: shoulders, knees, neck, back, hips
- numbers 16-20
- actions: wiggle your hips, move your shoulders, touch your back, bend your knees, bend your neck forward and back

Language Structures

- Does s/he have red hair? Does s/he have blue eyes?
- Is it (pupil's name)?

Letters

Pupils will be able to:

- recognize the letters G and I
- write the letters G and I
- match the big and small letters
- recognize the sound that the letters G and I make
- recognize words that start with the sound of the letters G and I
- identify words in the stories that start with the letters I, G, H, F, M, L, E, S, A, T, B, C, by sound and visually

Pupils will be exposed to the sequence of the alphabet.
